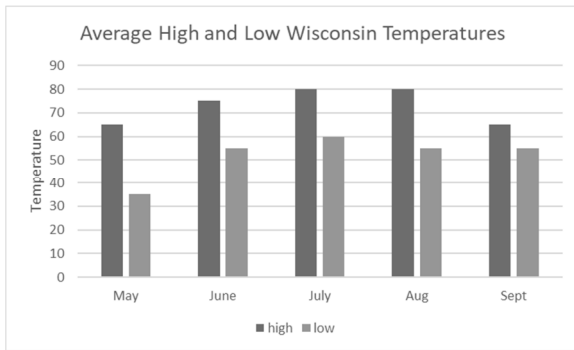


Working in Wisconsin Weather

The weather in East Central Wisconsin varies greatly throughout the year. Even the summer months tend to bring us great variety. Below is some information that will help you know how to pack and give you some idea of the weather you may be working in.

Weather in June

June typically begins our summer season here in Wisconsin. The weather grows warmer, and more humid and, while we have more sunny days than cloudy, it is one of the rainiest months of the year (4-5 inches). Average daytime temperatures range from 70-80 degrees for highs and 50-60 degrees for lows. Thunderstorms are common in June, and some of them can be severe with hail, lightening and strong winds. Tornadoes do occur during this time, but basements are built into almost every Wisconsin home and business to provide shelter should one occur.

Weather in July

July tends to be the hottest month of the year in Wisconsin. Overall, skies are clear, and sunshine is plentiful. The heat and humidity continue to increase, providing temperatures in the 75-85 degree range during the day (though 90-95 degrees is possible) and 55-65 degree range at night. While our 70-75% humidity makes for great swimming days, be prepared to feel a little sticky while working in our

Severe Weather in Wisconsin

In Appleton, every Saturday at noon, the city tests its tornado warning system. Please do not be alarmed if, at noon on Saturday, you hear our tornado sirens, and/or hear severe weather tests on the TV or radio.

If a tornado or severe thunderstorm does occur, go to the basement of a sturdy building. If the building does not have a basement, go into an interior room on the lowest floor AWAY FROM ALL WINDOWS. If possible, cover yourself from flying debris.

If you are outside or in a vehicle, seek shelter in a building (mobile homes, sheds, RVs and tents are not safe). If no building is available, lay flat in a ditch or ravine, covering your head. Getting down low in your car and covering your head is an option, though cars are generally not considered to be a safe shelter during a tornado.

July humidity. Thunderstorms, possibly severe, and tornadoes can occur in July as well.

Weather in August

August is a hot, muggy month for Wisconsin. The amount of rain and thunderstorms increases, and the lingering heat encourages the fallen precipitation to saturate the air. High temperatures range from 70-80, and lows between 55-65 degrees. August mornings toward the end of the month can feel chilly in comparison to the daytime August heat. Thunderstorms are more frequent during August due to the high humidity and greater fluctuation in temperatures. Tornadoes are also still possible, though May through July typically hold a higher risk of occurrence.
