

Koinonia Singers



The Koinonia Singers are a lively group of about 40-45 high school students sharing their testimony of Jesus' love in the Gospel. The students express this through contemporary Christian songs, skits and fellowship in the form of a musical. The group is led by Larry Schultz, who is the Director of Koinonia Youth Ministries in the Milton and Janesville area of Rock County, Wisconsin.

“Koinonia” is an ancient Greek word for fellowship. Fellowship is getting together with other people, having fun, and sharing all that God is doing in their lives. That is what the students of the Koinonia Singers have been doing for over 40 years. The group is open to high school youth from any denomination or background.

Performing in churches, nursing homes, group homes, prisons, parks, fairs, and any other available place, the group doesn't claim to be totally professional; however, the group does share about the greatest “LOVE” known. Traveling around in a bus, the group stays in churches, camps, and homes. Along the way tourist attractions are visited as well as the original musical is performed. But most importantly, the students have an opportunity to grow in Christ through ministering to others.

When the group is not traveling they are at home attending local Koinonia Youth Group nights or bible study meetings, and many other retreats or youth functions.

This year's show is called “The END of the Road”. As the story unfolds the audience will learn with the characters that Jesus is “the way, the truth, the life” and the “Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end”. Jesus is not just a way to have a perfect life but all roads lead to Him! He is not just the road, but He is the end of all our roads. We hope you will come along with us as the cast travels down the highway in a big bus to discover these truths about Jesus!
