Preparing People to Meet Jesus	
Preparing people to meet Jesus requires a plea for help rising from a desperate sense of urgency. • "And he said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." (Luke 10:2, ESV)	
Preparing people to meet Jesus is done in a hostile environment.	
• "behold, I am sending you out as lambs in the midst of wolves." (Luke 10:2–3, ESV)	

Preparing people to meet Jesus requires God's provision. • "Carry no moneybag, no knapsack, no sandals," (Luke 10:4, ESV)	
Preparing people to meet Jesus requires contentment in your context of service. "Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be to this house!' And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest upon him. But if not, it will retum to you. And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the laborer deserves his wages. Do not go from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and they receive you, eat what is set before you." (Luke 10:5–8, ESV)	
God supernaturally lays the groundwork to prepare people to meet Jesus. • "Heal the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.'" (Luke 10:9, ESV)
