The most comprehensive account we have of a prayer that Jesus prayed while on the earth is recorded in the <u>Gospel of John chapter</u> <u>17</u>. Jesus eloquently, and passionately poured out his heart to God the Father on the night before the crucifixion.

Central themes of that prayer include protection over His followers and unity among those who proclaim Him as Savior and Lord. The purpose of these requests resides in Jesus' statement, "so that the world may believe that You have sent Me." (John 17:21)

Today we can stand in the confidence of God's protection over His church. Jesus made the statement earlier in His ministry that He would establish the church with Himself as the Rock, the chief corner stone, and the gates of Hell would not prevail against it. God's church is an unstoppable force in this world. Yes, individual congregations may come and go, yet the faithful followers of our Lord Jesus Christ will always be an indestructible force in this world. A specific congregation will be a part of that mighty wave as long as we faithfully focus on giving effective witness to the fact that God has provided a Savior for the world.

The key to this effective witness is unity among His followers. Jesus sets a high standard in this prayer, "that they may all be one, just as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You." Wow! What a benchmark. The church of our Lord Jesus Christ is made up of people. We are diverse in so many ways. How can we possibly achieve this degree of unity.

The answer is simple. We focus on our Lord Jesus Christ. Remember this prayer was prayed the night before the crucifixion. Even in that moment Jesus had an outward focus on preparing His followers for what would come. Preparing people to meet Jesus is demanding and even dangerous work in a horribly broken world. It is so great to know that we have the prayers of our Lord Jesus Christ covering us and His presence as the Great Shepherd protecting and guiding us.
